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<p>Transportation</p> <p>Appropriations from the bill are changes to the appropriations in Laws 2009, chapter 36, article 1, to the agencies and for the purposes specified in Article 10 of HF 1671 (HF2591DE). The appropriation for trunk highway construction is \$112 million in fiscal year 2011, which reflects an increase in the formula-based apportionment of federal aid. It reduces \$12.9 million from the general fund for Met Council bus operations. HF2591DE also establishes a new account for using emergency funds for trunk highway work, where the funds would be reimbursed by the federal government.
